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HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE 120th SESSION OF THE IOC COUNCIL OF MEMBERS

On 20 November 2024, the Council of Members convened in Madrid for its 120th session, a key moment to review progress in olive growing, chemistry, and economics. Notable achievements included new initiatives such as the development of a tool to measure the carbon balance of olive groves, the recognition of an Iranian germplasm collection as an international collection, and the integration of a Spanish gene bank into the International Treaty on Plant Genetic Resources.

THE INTERNATIONAL OLIVE SECTOR MEETS AT IOC HEADQUARTERS



On 19 November 2024, the Advisory Committee met at the IOC headquarters, bringing together representatives from over 30 countries. Discussions focused on resilience to climate challenges, innovations to improve quality, and opportunities to expand into new markets. Participants also commended the IOC's efforts to establish harmonised standards and promote excellence within the sector.

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SUCCESS OF WORLD OLIVE DAY 2024



On 21 November 2024, the IOC celebrated the 30th anniversary of the Mediterranean Diet Pyramid in Madrid during World Olive Day. The event gathered leading public health and nutrition experts to highlight the Mediterranean diet, with olive oil as its cornerstone. Discussions emphasised the health benefits and sustainability of this dietary model, particularly relevant in the face of current climate challenges.

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IOC LAUNCHES PROMOTION CAMPAIGN IN BRAZIL

The IOC officially launched a promotion campaign in Brazil in partnership with the Brazilian Ministry of Agriculture and other local stakeholders. Executive Director Jaime Lillo and María Juárez, Head of the Economy and Promotion Unit, inaugurated the initiative with activities including a sensory analysis course in São Paulo and visits to olive groves in Rio Grande do Sul. Running until 2027, this campaign aims to promote IOC standards, enhance product quality and sustainability, and support the growth of the local olive industry.

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15th MEETING OF THE IOC STATISTICS MONITORING GROUP

KICK-OFF FOR THE OLIVE GROVE CARBON BALANCE PROJECT





Experts from 25 countries analysed recent global market data for olive oil and table olives. Discussions addressed the impact of climate change, production and price trends, and the importance of reliable data to guide public and private policy.

The IOC has launched an ambitious project with AENOR to assess the carbon balance of olive groves in the context of voluntary carbon credit markets. The project aims to develop methodological tools to measure CO_2 emissions and absorption, promoting the role of olive groves as an essential tool for fighting climate change.

This collaboration highlights the IOC's leadership in harmonising international standards.





IOC AT THE 47th CODEX ALIMENTARIUS COMMISSION MEETING



The IOC participated in the 47th session of the Codex Alimentarius Commission (CAC47) held in Geneva from 25 to 30 November 2024. Represented by Dr Mercedes Fernández Albaladejo and Dr Yousra Antit, the IOC showcased its unique role in harmonising international standards for olive oil and table olives.

IRAQI PRIME MINISTER ANNOUNCES THE COUNTRY'S INTENTION TO REJOIN THE IOC



During a meeting with IOC Executive Director Jaime Lillo, Iraqi Prime Minister Mohammed Shia' Al Sudani announced that the Iraqi Parliament has expressed its intention to rejoin the 2015 International Agreement on Olive Oil and Table Olives. This decision marks a significant step towards Iraq's reintegration into the IOC, following a period of absence due to economic and administrative challenges. The IOC welcomes this initiative, which paves the way for enhanced cooperation with Iraq.

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IOC AT THE 12th CIHEAM MINISTERIAL MEETING

The IOC participated in the 12th meeting of agriculture ministers from the International Centre for Advanced Mediterranean Agronomic Studies (CIHEAM) on 25 October 2024 in Rabat. This high-level event focused on food sovereignty and sustainable agri-food systems. IOC Executive Director Jaime Lillo emphasised the importance of international cooperation for sustainable and environmentally friendly agriculture, reaffirming the IOC's central role in promoting olive growing as a vital component of food security and sustainable development in the Mediterranean region.

IOC INVITED TO THE AL-JOUF AGRICULTURAL FORUM IN SAUDI ARABIA



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OLIVE OIL: A PILLAR OF SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC SUSTAINABILITY IN THE MEDITERRANEAN DIET



The IOC recently participated in the "Agroecology and Mediterranean Diet Days" conference in Tunis, organised by the Tunisian Permaculture Association and the Tunisian Agroecological Transition Network. Represented by Imene Trabelsi, the IOC highlighted the essential role of olive oil not only as a key ingredient of the Mediterranean diet but also as a driver of social and economic sustainability. Discussions focused on the positive impact of olive growing on rural communities, regional development, and cultural heritage preservation.

IOC ORGANISES COURSE ON OLIVE OIL QUALITY FOR THE US SECTOR

During a theoretical and practical course on olive oil quality and authenticity held in Andalusia, the IOC welcomed representatives from the USDA and the Culinary Institute of America. Participants explored quality criteria, participated in tastings, and discovered innovations in the sector. This initiative supports the global dissemination of IOC standards.



IOC HOSTS SEMINAR ON THE SENSORY ANALYSIS OF TABLE OLIVES IN AMMAN

IOC STRENGTHENS COLLABORATION WITH ELGO-DIMITRA AND THE UNIVERSITY OF PERUGIA



Twenty-five participants from the public and private sectors attended a seminar organised by the IOC in Jordan. Sessions covered sensory analysis, nutrition, and processing methods for table olives. A technical visit enabled participants to deepen their knowledge and exchange best practices.



The IOC recently signed two Memorandums of Understanding with ELGO-DIMITRA in Greece and the University of Perugia in Italy. These partnerships aim to advance research, innovation, and training in the olive sector, focusing on technology transfer, sustainable development, and support for students and researchers to address environmental and economic challenges.

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THE IOC ADVANCES OLIVE GENETIC RESOURCE CONSERVATION



The IOC continues to lead global efforts to safeguard olive genetic resources through collaboration with the FAO's International Treaty on Plant Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture. As part of this mission, the IOC is integrating its olive gene banks into the International Treaty framework to combat genetic erosion and ensure long-term conservation. In a milestone development, the IOC, in collaboration with the University of Cordoba, plans to deposit an initial batch of olive pits in the Svalbard Gene Bank in Norway in February 2025, with preparations for an agreement with the gene bank currently underway.
